

How to Submit Homework

Electronically Submitting Homework

In CS 110, we will be using electronic submission via FTP to turn in assignments. You will need an FTP program to turn in your assignments. All of the Macs in the clusters should have a program named Fetch which can be used for this purpose. If you are using a PC, I recommend WS_FTP, which can be downloaded from Stanford or at <http://www.ipswitch.com>. There should be a “lite” version available for educational users.

When preparing to submit, make sure that your assignment is in its own directory, as you will need to submit the entire directory, not just one file. Submitting the entire directory makes it easier on the grader, as he will not have to recreate your project or settings, which means your assignments will be graded more quickly. Also, **you must name the directory you plan to submit with your full name** (for example: “John Smith”). **Naming it something like Lab 0 is not acceptable.** You cannot actually overwrite someone’s submission—this is to prevent confusion and possible mingling of submissions. If two people tried to submit a directory with the same name, then the second person’s transmission would fail and he or she might not understand why. Feel free to add more descriptive text after your name, for example, “John Smith – Lab 0” is perfectly acceptable. If you need to resubmit, you must use a unique directory name for each submission. For example, if you submitted originally as “John Smith – Lab 0,” you should resubmit with something like “John Smith – Lab 0 #2” or “John Smith – Lab 0-2”. **Each submission must have a unique name**, as you cannot overwrite files already on the server. Also, if you resubmit, please email the TA and let him know which submission to grade.

To actually submit, connect using one of the aforementioned FTP programs to `junx.stanford.edu` as anonymous with your email address as the password. Once connected, change to `/pub/CS110`. You will not get a directory listing for this directory. Simply transfer your entire directory over. You will not see your directory show up. If you did not receive an error, your assignment was submitted correctly. If you did receive an error, try submitting with a different directory name. If you still have problems, please e-mail the TA.

Assignments must be electronically submitted by midnight the day they are due.

Submitting Assignment Hardcopies

Paper copies for each assignment are due the class following the deadline for each assignment. For example, if an assignment were due on Wednesday, a hardcopy would be due next Monday. However, this does not mean that the assignment can be electronically submitted on that Monday without penalty. If you so desire, you are welcome to turn in hardcopies early.

Please only print out what you wrote or modified, not any provided code; save some trees.
